## Spring Derby

The Spring Derby is fast approaching. Included with this newsletter is the Spring Derby Show Bill. This year, along with the derby classes, there is an opportunity to show older horses in the Bridle Spectacular classes. For those of you not familiar with a Bridle Spectacular – these classes are for bridle horses, age 6 and up. The classes are structured like the derby, with 3 separate classes; herd work, rein work, and fence work. Combined scores for the 3 separate elements produce the overall winner in each of the Bridle Spectacular classes. These are national approved classes and results will qualify for NRCHA year end standings. Please review the show bill carefully. There are national classes for everyone, as well as AQHA Reining and AQHA Working Cow. We're running some club show classes concurrent with the NRCHA classes on Sunday, (also new!) The sanctioned Spring Derby will be held at Simons Arena in Cannon Falls, MN. This is an amazing place to showcase your horse. We also need volunteers for the Spring Derby. Volunteering for this show will be a way to further our success as an organization.
